More than meets eye to young swimmer

MURDOCH College swimming sensation Raife Sillence is Swimming WA's Junior Swimmer of the year, but there is more to the schoolboy than meets the eye.

The 13 year old made headlines in 2000 for a completely different story, when his proud parents Steve and Allison Sillence gave birth to him 19 years after Steve's sperm was frozen.

Mrs Sillence said both her children, Raife and Scarlett (10) were conceived during IVF treatment after Steve's sperm was flown from Australia to England in a military style operation.

"We married in 1992 and after 10 years we gave birth to two healthy children who are doing ex-

tremely well," Mrs Sillence said.

Both the Sillence children won scholarships to Murdoch College at the age of 9, and now at the age of 13 Raife is in Year 10.
