



## PERTH CITY SWIMMING CLUB UNIFORM POLICY

### Rationale

The Perth City Swimming Club (“the Club”) considers all its members to be a part of a team. The Club considers teamwork and unity to be fundamental to the success of all its athletes. As a member of The Club, athletes agree to abide by the uniform requirements of this policy where applicable, and to the best of their ability. These guidelines apply to both pool and open-water competition where the swimmer represents the Club.

### General Club Uniform - Red

The General Uniform is to be worn at all meets where the swimmer represents Perth City Swimming Club, except Australian Championships. This includes local Club meets, State Championship Meets, Swimming WA Sanctioned Meets and Inter-State meets and applies to both pool and open-water swimmers. The General Uniform consists of:

- Red polo
- Red round neck t-shirt
- Red jacket
- Red swimming caps
- Optional track shorts
- Optional track pants

All items from the General Uniform range are to be purchased by members. The minimum suggested uniform is that all swimmers have a Club red polo, a Club red round neck t-shirt, and a Club jacket. Club track shorts and track pants are optional. These can be purchased on the Club website or by contacting the Uniform Officer.



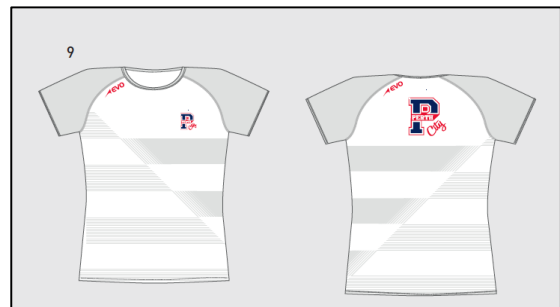
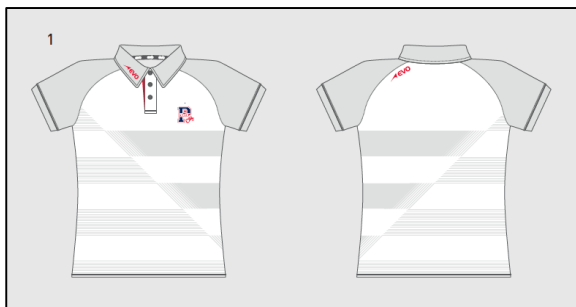
## National Championships Uniform – White

The Australian Championships Uniform is only to be worn at Australian Championship level meets where the swimmer represents Perth City Swimming Club. The Australian Championships Uniform consists of a white polo shirt and a white round neck t-shirt. Swimmers representing the Club at a Australian Championship event will be supplied with one white polo shirt and one white round neck t-shirt per season. If a swimmer attends two or more different Australian Championship meets, they will be supplied with one polo shirt and one white round neck t-shirt which they will be expected to use for all meets. Club track shorts and track pants are optional.

Australian Championship swimmers will also have the opportunity to have their red Club jacket embroidered with “Australian Championships” at the Club’s expense to acknowledge their achievement. Swimmers who would like their jackets embroidered should contact the Club’s Uniform Officer to make the necessary arrangements.

The Australian Championships Uniform consists of:

- White polo (supplied by the Club)
- White round neck t-shirt (supplied by the Club)
- Red jacket (purchased by members from General Club Uniform range. Embroidery optional & arranged by Club as required)
- Club National swimming caps (ordinarily supplied by the Club)



### **Training Attire**

Swimmers are encouraged to wear all uniform items not included in the General Uniform or Australian Championships uniform as training attire. Training attire includes all pre-2018 uniform items that are no longer in supply. For example, pre-2018 navy round neck t-shirts, Australian Championship attire, navy caps and Club hoodies.

### **Supporters Uniform**

Club supporters (e.g. parents and volunteers) will be able to and are encouraged to purchase any item from the General Club Uniform range. Supporters may also purchase pre-2018 uniform items. There is no official uniform policy that applies to supporters of the Club.

### **Optional Uniform Items**

Optional uniform items may be worn in addition to the general uniform at local or inter-state meets, as well as Australian Championship events. Optional uniform items include, but are not limited to:

- Club deck jackets
- Club wide-brim hats or baseball caps
- Club towels
- Club backpacks
- Club mesh gear bags
- Club open water long sleeve shirts
- Club bathers (design may change from time to time)

Supply of these items may be limited. Sale is subject to availability, and may require pre-order. The Club may add or cease production of optional uniform items from time to time.

### **Medal Ceremony Attire**

Perth City athletes being presented with medals must be appropriately dressed during the ceremony. The minimum requirement for members appearing on the medal dais is at local, club, state or inter-state is:

- red Club polo shirt OR red Club polo shirt **and** red Club jacket
- Club shorts or tracksuit pants, or own smart shorts or tracksuit pants
- shoes.

The minimum requirement for athletes appearing on the medal dais at an Australian Championship meet, where representing the Club is:

- white Club polo shirt OR white Club polo shirt **and** red Club jacket
- Club shorts or tracksuit pants, or own smart shorts or tracksuit pants
- Smart, enclosed running shoes.

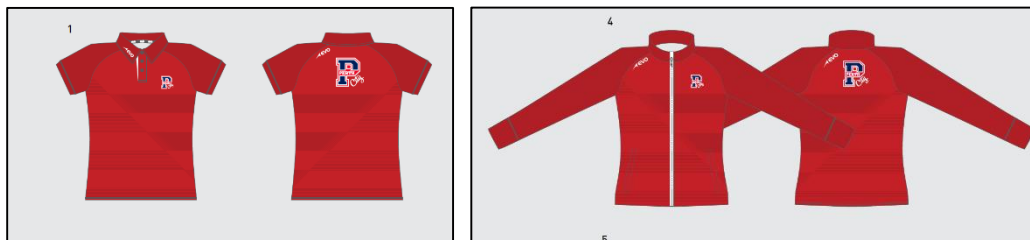

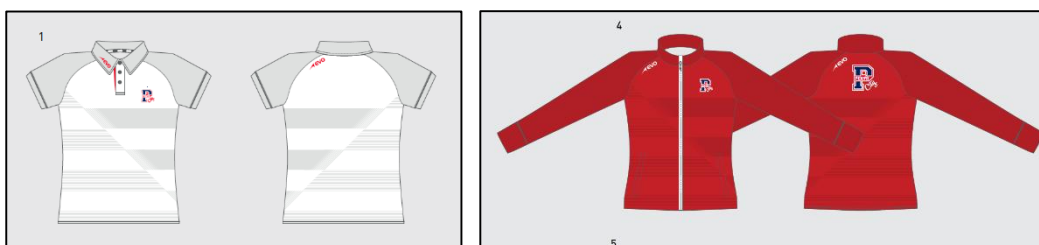
## UNIFORM POLICY – SUMMARY

**Travel to and from competition venue - pool and open water swimmers  
(including travelling by plane and travelling to the pool/venue)**

**Minimum requirement: Club Polo OR Club Polo and Club Jacket**



*At local Club meets, State Championship Meets, Swimming WA Sanctioned Meets and Inter-State meets*



*At Australian Championship level meets where the swimmer represents Perth City Swimming Club\**

*\*White polo provided to Australian Championship competitors by the Club*

### During competition

**Minimum requirement: Club Round Neck T-Shirt and Club Cap** (other additional Club uniform items may be worn during competition – e.g. Club deck coats).

*At Australian Championship level meets where the swimmer represents Perth City Swimming Club\*\**

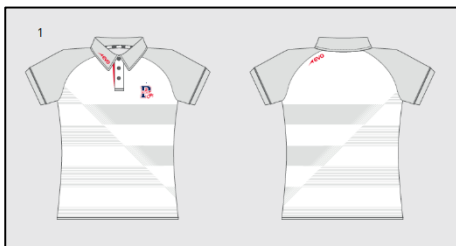
